COURSE DESCRIPTION

This study of the Book of Acts pays careful attention to its theology as well as to its practical application for Christian life and mission. God's Spirit worked powerfully in the early church as many were drawn to salvation in Jesus, the sick healed and the Gospel message spread from Jerusalem to Rome. This examination of the Spirit's work in the past will help committed Christ followers apply the truths of Scripture to the present.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completing the course, students will be able to:

- Summarize the general plotlines of Acts, with an historical framework for the development of the early Church
- Understand the role of the Holy Spirit in the life/mission of the church and the believer
- Apply principles from Acts, both individually and within the larger church body
- Engage more intentionally in God's mission of advancing the Good News of Jesus Christ locally and globally

1. Bible Reading (10%)

Students are required to read through the entire book of Acts. Use any translation you desire; however, a more dynamic equivalent translation is recommended.

2. Textbook Review (40%)

Students must read through all of the assigned textbook pages (half of the grade will be given for finishing the assigned reading). After reading the textbook, students must write a 500-word reflection paper in which they discuss both the most significant insight they gained from the book as well as one practical application gleaned from their reading.

Due: November 6, 2024

3. Topical Study (40%)

Students will choose a topic from the list below and study how that theme is developed throughout the book of Acts. Students should begin by compiling a list of every passage in the book of Acts that pertains to their topic. After studying the topic thoroughly, students are to write a 1000-1500 word paper sharing what they have learned in a logical and organized manner. This assignment should be completed without the use of secondary sources (please resist the temptation to use online word searches as this will undercut the assignment). Only a Bible is necessary.
