I'm sure you've all seen the #Metoo movement sweeping through Hollywood and politics in particular. My response is, "it's about time!" The rumors of sexual abuse and the glorification of sexual deviancy in movies are legendary. While it is helpful for society to acknowledge the problem, we still hope for healing and that can only be truly found in Jesus.

#### Jesus frees us to discover our true identity

- 1. We try to change our behavior instead of the underlying belief that determines our behavior.
- 2. We focus on ourselves and what we should do instead of focusing on God and what He has already done.
- 3. We rely on our own efforts instead of trusting God and living by the power of the Holy Spirit.
- We accept a failure identity instead of appropriating our true identity in Christ.

#### Jesus frees us to live in freedom

Your past is your story, your present is where you are making your decisions, and your future is up to you. If you let your past determine your future it is because of choices you are making in the present.

#### Jesus frees us to forgive

The desire to forgive is acquired through honest grieving and caring for the wounds that exist. Quick forgiveness, like any fight-or-flight oriented behavior, only reinforces the harm and doesn't bring about healing.
