

BIBLE STUDY QUESTIONS

- Take some time to catch up. How did this week go? What steps of obedience did you take and what has God been teaching you?
- 2. Take time to read Revelation 2:8-11. What stands out to you from the text and/or sermon that Bryan preached? Was there something you had not noticed before?
- 3. Jesus describes Himself to the church as "the first and the last, who died and came to life." Why would this description be particularly meaningful to the church in Smyrna? Read Matthew 10:28-33 to help answer the question.
- 4. Around the world, we have brothers and sisters who are suffering physically, emotionally, economically, and relationally because of their faith in Jesus. Take some time to pray for the churches in countries you know of that are being persecuted.
- 5. Most of us don't compromise in our faith because we are afraid of being killed. We compromise for far less than that. In which areas of life do you think Christians most feel the pressure to compromise? From where does that pressure come?
- 6. How do you feel led to respond to this week's message and text? Are there steps of obedience you feel the Spirit asking you to take? How can we pray for you as a group?

February 2 & 3, 2019

The Lord Jesus was direct in His warning to the Church in Smyrna - they were going to suffer. Christ never hides from His people that they can anticipate opposition, and violent hostility in many instances. To be frank, suffering for Jesus' sake is a foreign concept for most of us in North America, although increasing antagonism towards evangelical Christianity suggests our situation is beginning to change. The message to the Church of Smyrna is full of both warning and tremendous encouragement for us. Will we stand fearless and remain faithful when the tests grow tougher?

1. Rely on the person of Jesus (2:8)

To persevere for the sake of Christ requires that we know the resurrected Lord.

2. Recognize the reality of your situation (2:9-10)

"I know of your afflictions and your poverty - yet you are rich!" What a statement! Grinding suffering contrasted with spiritual wealth and vitality.

3. Respond in Christ's strength (2:10)

In their own strength, the believers in Smyrna would have been fearful and faithless, but Jesus calls for the exact opposite response - be fearless and faithful.

4. Receive your reward (2:10-11)

Jesus is "the first and the last" who rewards those who overcome with the crown of life. The true purpose of a Christian's suffering is meant to both prove and improve our faith.
