#### LIFE GROUPS

- Take some time to catch up. How did this week go? What steps of obedience did you take and what has God been teaching you?
- Take time to read John 5:1-17. What stands out to you from the text and/ or sermon that Pastor Ray preached? Is there something that you did not know/ notice before?
- 3. The sick man does not realize that Jesus is capable of healing him. Are there areas of your life where you need healing but have not asked Jesus? What about the lives of those around you? Do you often pray for healing, or is it a last resort?
- 4. Jesus asks the sick man, "Do you want to be healed?" If you could experience immediate healing in an area of your life, which area would you choose? What steps are you able to take towards health in that area in the meantime?
- 5. Read John 5:14. What does this verse suggest about the relationship between sin and sickness for this man? Now read John 9:1-3. How do these verses help to balance our perspective on the relationship between sin and sickness?
- 6. How do you feel led to respond to this week's message and text? Are there steps of obedience you feel the Spirit asking you to take? How can we pray for you as a group?

October 20 & 21, 2018

At the end of John 4, an official, from Capernaum, approaches Jesus in the city of Cana. His son is at the point of death. He pleads with Jesus to come heal his son before he dies. Jesus says, "Go; your son will live." He speaks the word of healing from 25 kilometers away. Does Jesus still heal miraculously in our day? What is the path to healing?

- 1. Healing happens when the Father wants it to happen
- 2. To walk in healing, we must walk in obedience to the Father
  - a. Stop being a victim
  - b. Obey the Word of the Lord
  - c. Stop the blameshifting
  - d.Own your wholeness
  - e. Stop the sinning
- 3. We can miss the healing work of the Father because of our sin and theology
- 4. We walk in healing by
  - a. Submitting to Jesus
  - b. Staying in step with the healing work of the Spirit
  - c. Seizing the opportunities to exercise faith
