- 6. How do you feel led to respond to this week's message and text? Are there steps of obedience you feel the Spirit asking you to take? How can we pray for you as a group?

Thirst is part of the human condition. Yu-Kai Chou, in his studies on gamification and behavioral design, concludes that we have eight core drives (or thirsts). We long for meaning, growth, empowerment, ownership and social acceptance. Sometimes, we are driven by the fear of the unknown, the fear of not having something, or the fear of missed opportunities. In this world of competing drives and thirsts, what does Jesus offer? What does it mean for us to accept his offer?

- 1. Jesus has never been a <u>neutral</u> figure, so do not be surprised when he continues to <u>polarize</u> people in our day.
- 2. Know who Jesus was and who you are.
- 3. Jesus satisfies our <u>deepest longings</u> and turns us into <u>wellsprings</u>. <u>Drink</u> the water; don't <u>sip</u> it.
