Because of this, we will find many of the things that Paul says easy to relate to and apply to our own lives.

3. We can be sure that God's character and His faithfulness to His promises will never change
4. This is what we ought to pray for each other. That our love and knowledge would increase as we seek to live lives of faithful discipleship to Jesus
