- If you belong to Jesus, then the following is true for you: grace abounds, you are in the right before God, you have power to not sin, you have victory over death, and you share in the life of God, now and forever. Which of these truths is most meaningful for you today? Why?
- If you have never embraced the second major turning that came with Jesus, why have you chosen to remain with Adam?
