FAITH @ HOME

The tax collector knew he needed God to forgive him, and he cried out to God. Jesus took the punishment for our sin by dying on the cross. We can cry out to God like the tax collector and because of Jesus, God will have mercy on us. Memory Verse: Exodus 34:6-7 **He said, "I am the Lord, the Lord. I am the God who is tender and kind. I am gracious. I am slow to get angry. I am faithful and full of love. I forgive wickedness and sin. But I do not let guilty people go without punishing them."**

Four Key Questions:

Use these questions as you go through this week's Bible passages.

1. Did you understand this passage? What was it about?
2. What do we learn about God from this passage? What do we learn about people?
3. Are there any commands to obey or promises to remember in this passage? Why do they matter?
4. What does this passage teach you about God's Kingdom?

Family Activity:

Take two pieces of paper and something to draw with. Read through Luke 18 and draw the tax collector and the Pharisee based on what the parable says. We now have two pictures of men that entered the temple to pray. The tax collector saw his sin and cried out to God for mercy and is an example on how we are to follow God and pray.
