We want to help you learn and grow together as a family. Build a family routine that includes time spent reading the Bible and praying together. This could be in the morning, over dinner, at bedtime, or whenever else works for your family!

Family Activity:

Think about a special day. This can be your birthday, Christmas, summer vacation. Grab a calendar and count how many days there are until your special day. Waiting can be hard, especially when we are waiting on a special day to arrive. God's people had to wait a very long time for Jesus to come. Take some time to think about how long God's people waited. Did you know that just between the time of the prophet Malachi and the birth of Jesus, at least 400 years had passed? Even though God's people had to wait, God always keeps His promises.

Next Week Preview:

Throughout the Old Testament, God promised the arrival of a King who would redeem people. When Jesus arrived, Simeon and Anna knew He was the promised Messiah, God's own Son. We can trust Jesus for our salvation, and like Simeon and Anna, we should share the good news.
