

Four Key Questions:

Use these questions as you go through this week's Bible passages.

- 1. Did you understand this passage? What was it about?
- 2. What do we learn about God from this passage? What do we learn about people?
- 3. Are there any commands to obey or promises to remember in this passage? Why do they matter?
- 4. What does this passage teach you about God's Kingdom?

We want to help you learn and grow together as a family. Build a family routine that includes time spent reading the Bible and praying together. This could be in the morning, over dinner, at bedtime, or whenever else works for your family!

Family Activity:

Discuss with your family on what it means when Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life." Look up Jesus' six other "I am" statements in the Gospel of John:
