Four Key Questions:

Use these questions as you go through this week's Bible passages.

1. Did you understand this passage? What was it about?
2. What do we learn about God from this passage? What do we learn about people?
3. Are there any commands to obey or promises to remember in this passage? Why do they matter?
4. What does this passage teach you about God's Kingdom?

We want to help you learn and grow together as a family. Build a family routine that includes time spent reading the Bible and praying together. This could be in the morning, over dinner, at bedtime, or whenever else works for your family!

Family Activity:

Share with your family the ways you have experienced God's goodness. Perhaps God has shown you He is good by providing something for you or helping you in a time of need or being with them through a hard time. You may write down or draw your response and your family's response on a large paper so you can visualize how God has been good to you and your family!

God is good and kind. He loves us and shows His love for us in many ways, including saving us from sin through Jesus. Knowing God is good leads us to want to serve Him and live for Him.
