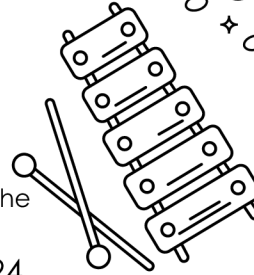
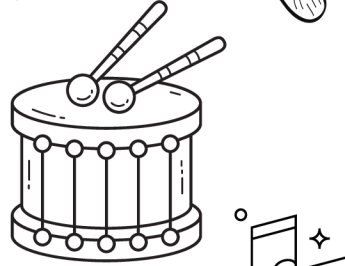

Family Activity:
