



What did you notice while reading? Write it down. Circle words you don't understand. Underline words that repeat. Write down any questions you have.



Talk to God about what He's teaching you. Ask Him how to meditate on and apply this scripture to your life.

We want to help you learn and grow together as a family. Build a family routine that includes time spent reading the Bible and praying together. This could be in the morning, over dinner, at bedtime, or whenever else works for your family!

Family Activity:

Our Bible story focuses on the Jerusalem Council, where early Christian leaders discussed whether Gentile believers needed to follow Jewish customs in order to find salvation. Read Acts 15:11.

We can show grace to others just as Jesus shows grace to us. Place a jar in the centre of the dining table. Throughout the week, have each member of your family write an example of showing grace (eg. forgiving a sibling, helping without being asked) and put it in the jar.

Read them together as a family at the end of the week!
