BIBLE STUDY QUESTIONS

1. Take some time to catch up. How did this week go? What steps of obedience did you take and what has God been teaching you?
2. Take time to read Revelation 2:12-17. What stands out to you from the text and/or sermon that Pastor Ray preached? Was there something you had not noticed before?
3. Jesus calls the church at Pergamum to repent. Often repentance is something we talk about as something that happens at the beginning of someone's walk with Jesus. To what extent do you think repentance should be an ongoing part of a believer's life? Why do you think so?
4. As we engage with the world around us, we need to make sure that we are influencing the world with the Kingdom's values, not embracing the world's values. Give examples from your life where you have seen both of these dynamics at play.
5. How do we protect ourselves and protect our church from compromise? What should we do if we see compromise present in the life of someone we love? What would you want someone to do if they see compromise in your life?
6. How do you feel led to respond to this week's message and text? Are there steps of obedience you feel the Spirit asking you to take? How can we pray for you as a group?
