BIBLE STUDY QUESTIONS

1. How did you see God at work in your life this week? Do you have any updates on things you've been praying for? How have you taken steps of obedience to God this week?
2. Can you think of a time when you experienced suffering because of a bad decision or a bad choice? How is this different from the type of suffering Peter is talking about?
3. Read 1 Peter 4:1-4 and then read 1 Peter 4:12-13. How are these passages related to each other? What are the unbelievers surprised by? What are the believers not to be surprised by?
4. This week's sermon talked about the relationship between suffering and compromise. Have you ever been in a situation where compromising on your faith would have allowed you to avoid suffering? How often do you find yourself in those situations?
5. How do you feel called to respond to this week's text and sermon? What steps of obedience do you feel the Spirit is calling you to take this week?

We all have Expectations. Let me ask you, what do you expect from God? What do you expect the impact of following Him will be on your life? How will following Jesus impact your relationships, your work, and your place in society? Some people expect that their lives will be smooth sailing when they follow Jesus. Some people expect that everything will go their way... Is that what the Bible tells us or what the biblical history shows us?

In today's text, the apostle Peter sets expectations for his readers. He outlines what they should expect, and what we can expect when following Jesus.

1. Don't be **surprised** when following Jesus leads to **suffering**
2. We should **celebrate** when we **share** in Christ's sufferings
3. You are truly **blessed** when the Holy Spirit rests on you
4. Don't confuse **self-inflicted** suffering for God's **absence** in your life
5. God works to **strengthen** our faith and grow our **trust** in Him
6. You can trust God to **take care** of you to the end of time
